Obsessed by horror film star Lon Chaney, 10-year-old Alonzo dreams of transforming himself into "The Boy of a Thousand Faces."

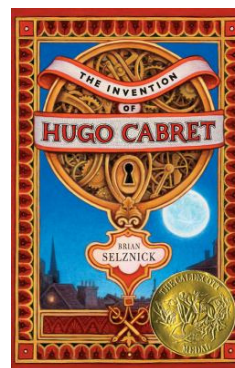

An antique family of porcelain dolls is taken aback when a new family of plastic dolls who don't follow The Doll Code of Honor come to live with them.

Best friend dolls Annabelle and Tiffany place all of dollkind in danger by running away to prevent their friend Tilly from being sent back to London.
